

Good News in our communities




Therefore, for our quotes page I thought I would choose some lines from Pope Francis.





Perhaps we could all think about leaving a financial gift when we die which can help towards the costs of mission and ministry for the future, particularly at this challenging time.


† Churchyards




SUDBROOK - Richard Clammer

Stimulated by the Group's evening visit to Sudbrook last year, Richard has been combining his maritime and local history interests by looking into the history of the former Sudbrook Shipyard. Very little has been written about the it, but a fascinating story is beginning to emerge:

The yard was opened in 1887, a year after the Severn Tunnel had been completed, partly to provide employment for the workers living in the village and partly to construct specialised vessels to be used on T.A. Walker's contracts in South America. Many of the earliest ships were hopper barges which steamed across the Atlantic and were used for carrying stone from the company's quarries in Uruguay to their harbour works at Buenos Aires. After Walker's untimely death, the yard was operated by his executors and then by his nephew C.H. Walker until it closed in 1922. Tugs, hoppers, coasters, the occasional sailing ship and numerous small harbour craft were built for a wide variety of customers and, in total, almost 200 "yard numbers" were recorded.

Richard is attempting to piece together the full history of the company and the individual ships it built, as well as trying to locate photographs, plans and documents. He has received valuable help from a large number of UK archives and shipping historians, and is also in correspondence with contacts in Argentina and Uruguay. The story becomes more fascinating by the day.

If anyone reading this has postcards, photos, plans, documents or knowledge that might help Richard in his search, do please get in touch.



While many of us know that food banks provide food – and are happy to donate tinned items and other grocery items – not all of us are aware that food banks could do with donations of other essential non-food items as well. "We asked food bank managers and users across the UK and these are all the things people say consistently – time and

time again – they need, but they are not things people often think to buy," says Molly Hodson, head of media and external affairs at the charity. "And they make such a difference."

1. Toilet roll

This is self-explanatory, and always necessary. "One food bank is having to ration it to one roll per household," says Hodson.

2. Sanitary towels and tampons

"We don't have the data on how users of the food banks break down across gender lines," says Hodson. "When someone comes to the food bank, they'll often pick up for the whole household." But she adds: "[Feminine hygiene products] are an awkward thing to say that you're short of. If you're at the point where you can't afford food, chances are that you're not going to be able to afford sanitary products either. It's really important, especially in terms of dignity, to be able to cope".

3. Tin openers

"There are all kinds of people who don't have these, especially women who've been relocated because of domestic abuse," says Hodson.

And as food banks get a lot of tinned, non-perishable food, this is a handy thing to drop off at the collection point.

4. Nappies

Generally, food banks would prefer disposable nappies over cloth nappies. "The best thing people can do is call their local food bank and find out what they need," says Hodson.

"We get parents with children of all ages. Some of the most stark cases are women who have literally just given birth and haven't got anything, and are really struggling as well as being a new mum."

5. Toiletries (shampoo, shower gel, deodorant)

You know how at Christmas, lots of people get packs of toiletries they don't want, because it's a bit of a standard present? Bring them along to your local food bank collection point. "If people don't want them," says Hodson, "it'd be amazing if they gave them to the food bank, because it's the kind of thing that makes a massive difference." Shaving gels and foams are also welcome.

6. Baby food

Baby food is another item that many people don't think to include on their list of donations to food banks, says Hodson. Well, now you know.

Start taking control by creating a budget. Have a look at moneysavingexpert.com/ banking/budget-planning and other free resources online to help you.

The next step is acting on any issues your budget brings up. If you've got more money going out than coming in, consider what you can cut down or cut out altogether. Perhaps you could switch to a cheaper energy tariff, or cancel that TV subscription you never use.



I have been involved in Ride and Stride for some years now, always on my bike till moving here. In Kent where I lived before it was a 'big deal' and on our last ride, 6



Traidcraft have some delicious varieties too, including selection packs for a different flavour bar each day, so ask Julia or Cate for a catalogue.




