Church leader Pete Greig (of the 24/7 prayer movement) reports on the increase in prayer activity within the UK. A Tearfund survey indicates that some 3 million new people have turned to prayer in the UK since lockdown began. Sales of Bibles have increased and Tearfund also reports record numbers attending church online. Normally about 5-7% of the UK population attend a Sunday act of worship. Now numbers indicate it is 24%! A few months ago who would have expected The Guardian newspaper to have a headline saying "British public turn to prayer as one in four tune in to religious services."

The Internet is proving to be a lifeline for communication and seems to be reaching new people with the Gospel. However, the increased reliance on technology can also stressful, with last Sunday morning proving to be a very stressful peak for me when, for no apparent reason, the YouTube live streaming didn't work. This left a number of individuals not being able to



access local worship on Sunday morning and wondering why their TV, computer, tablet or phone wasn't working. As you can imagine I felt really bad about this, and I'm really sorry if you were in that category!

I am therefore making an appeal to see who might be willing and able to assist with IT issues over the coming weeks and months? With restrictions to public gatherings unlikely to change anytime soon I would like us as a church to be able to provide access to worship material online. However I/we will need support with editing & producing pre-recorded videos that involve different people's contributions; assistance with the process of live streaming at home and when permitted, from the church building too. So if you have the skills and are willing to assist with one or several aspects of the above do *please* let me know asap!

Church of England Statement following government guidance on Covid 19



The Bishop of London, Sarah Mullally, said: "We note from the Government's COVID-19 Recovery Strategy that churches could be open from July as part of the conditional and phased plan to begin lifting the lockdown. We look forward to the time when we are able to gather again in our church buildings.

"We are examining what steps we will need to take to do so safely and are actively planning ahead in preparation. We strongly support the Government's approach of continuing to suppress the transmission of the virus and accordingly, we recognise that at this time public worship cannot return in the interests of public health and safety."
