Our Curate Nicki Bullivant writes this week about waiting,

"When I was growing up my least favourite word was 'wait'. Even now I still find waiting difficult. We live in a world of drive through take-aways, microwave meals, buying what we want on credit so that we can have what we want and so that we can have it now. I don't think that many of us like waiting but it is something that we all have to do each and every day. Waiting can evoke a wide range of emotions such as excitement,

anticipation, frustration or anxiety and dread. Some of us may be waiting for a child or grandchild to be born, for a promotion at work or to be able to hug a family member that we haven't been able to hug for months due to lockdown. For some of us the waiting isn't about a positive expectation or change, we may be waiting for a decision about a possible redundancy or results from a biopsy.

Some of the most well- known characters in the Bible – Abraham, Joseph, Moses, David, Hannah- had to wait for many years for answers to their prayers and for the fulfilment God's promises to them. Everything that happened in their time of waiting was used to prepare them inwardly as well as outwardly. Waiting, Biblical waiting is not a passive waiting around for something to happen, waiting is not just something we have to do to get what we want, waiting can be a process of becoming who God wants us to be. What God does in is while we wait is as important as what it is that we are waiting for. God encourages us to wait not in frustration but in stillness. Waiting can be a nurturing time when God is working behind the scenes.

God invites each and every one of us to trust in His goodness towards us today and in His faithfulness for tomorrow. Trusting God in our waiting and relinquishing our need to always be in control can be way to experience His love and peace. Paula Gooder in her book 'The meaning is in the Waiting' says, 'It is in Jesus Christ that we discover the perfect fulfilment of everything for which we have waited- as well as for those things for which we have not waited. Waiting can clear our vision, sharpen our insight and enable us to see Jesus, the one who was and is to come, in our midst'.

I pray that as we wait we will wait with expectant and trusting hearts, believing that God is with us in our waiting. I pray that as we wait we will be enfolded in His love and will listen for His still small voice as He speaks peace to our anxieties and hope into our hearts."
