Where is the Church?

In recent weeks there have been reports of people asking where the church has been over the duration of this Covid 19 crisis. Indeed there have been voices complaining that the church has been silent and inactive over these days.



I guess that some of this comes from the fact that our church buildings have been closed and if your understanding of the church is wholly confined to bricks and mortar then yes the church has been very much silent and inactive. However, the church, the Body of Christ, is the people of God who happen to use extraordinarily wonderful (expensive and at times crumbly) buildings to gather; and through this time the people of God, the church, despite not being able to gather together face to face in church buildings, has been anything but silent or inactive. The church has been working flat out in our

hospitals and care homes, educating children online and in school and serving customers in shops. The church has been delivering meals to the housebound, looking out for family, friends and neighbours and phoning people up to see if they are okay. The church has been involved in food production and carrying out logistics operations. The church has been active in the private, public and voluntary sectors often working in trying conditions. The church has been carrying out funerals, providing online worship all over the country; she has been engaging in political debate; she has been supporting people with debt and she has been praying ceaselessly... and so much more.

See the church is all who follow Jesus Christ and call themselves Christians. The church is those filled with the Spirit of the risen Lord Jesus and living lives displaying his love and goodness. The church is you (not just me), and I'm pretty sure that most of you have not been silent or inactive!

We will shortly celebrate the glorious feast of Pentecost when we recall the pouring out of the Holy Spirit on the disciples. The same Spirit that raised Jesus from the dead and was poured out on the day of Pentecost 2,000 years ago is available to us today so that we too can be inspired, equipped and empowered to carry out the works of the Lord Jesus and be involved in the renewing of creation.

Come Holy Spirit and let the fire of your love burn in our hearts and throughout the world. God bless

Chepstow Foodbank Update



Since lockdown at the end of March, our foodbank has moved from the face-to-face tood pank distribution centres to a Referral Agency Collection Service only. This means we can work safely, limiting the number of contacts to contain the potential spread of

Coronavirus - yet still feeding vulnerable families ensuring no one in our area goes hungry. There has been a 36% increase in the foodbank use compared with the same period last year, but the people who are using the service has changed. More single people are being referred to the foodbank and there is a reduction in the number of families being referred - families who receive Free School Meals are having payments made straight into bank accounts, allowing them to buy the food they need for their children.

Food donations can still be placed in the box in Tesco - these are collected twice a week. So if you are to shop/arrange for items to be put there, they will be very welcome. We currently need tinned vegetables (peas, carrots & potatoes), rice pudding, tinned fruit, pasta & rice, pasta sauces, jam, soap/hand wash, washing-up liquid, washing powder/liquid. We are also extremely thankful for food donations being given from a number of local businesses and organisations.

Please pray for our foodbank clients. Some of the stories of the people we are currently helping are really desperate and the referral agencies are working very hard in the current climate. Obviously, as Pentecost is only a week away, I will need a fairly quick turn around, but I'm trying to keep it simple so that as many people as possible will be able to take part. I will be available for tech support in terms of recording etc. if needed.

Church of England Statement following government guidance on Covid 19



The Bishop of London, Sarah Mullally, said: "We note from the Government's COVID-19 Recovery Strategy that churches could be open from July as part of the conditional and phased plan to begin lifting the lockdown. We look forward to the time when we are able to gather again in our church buildings.

"We are examining what steps we will need to take to do so safely and are actively planning ahead in preparation. We strongly support the Government's approach of continuing to suppress the transmission of the virus and accordingly, we recognise that at this time public worship cannot return in the interests of public health and safety."

Children & Families - Jane Penny is producing worship resources suitable for families and children which will be available via email.
