It is quite understandable that many of us feel anxious about what the future will bring and what it might look like. But I would just urge myself and you not to allow the shadow of Covid-19 to block out the future, the possibilities, the good and the lovely... to block you and me from the light and love of God in Christ and the life he brings.

A Call to Prayer this Summer: Be prayerful (Eph 6:18)!

During July and August I would like members of the church in the Parish to try and join in with three things:

- 1. **Rest**. I hope that these summer months afford you some time to rest. I love the definition of rest as 'unthreatened wellbeing.' From such a place good things can come.
- 2. **Gather**. As the church please do gather with one another. Gather in the church buildings for official services or for private prayer, or online. Or perhaps gather informally in gardens, in online chatrooms or chat on the phone... yes to touch base with each other and socialise but please also gather to pray.
- 3. **Prayer**. Whether it is prayers on Zoom or Facebook, whether having drinks and takeaways in gardens, whether Life Groups or music groups, whether Eucharist in Tidenham or the marquee, whether walking or having phone calls, or at home alone I want to ask you the people of God to pray for the Church, the Parishes here and for the world!

As your Vicar I'm calling you to pray. Why? Because we need God and because "there are things God longs for which haven't yet happened." (Pete Greig). Let's not just talk or write about praying together but actually pray. We are unsure of exactly what's next for our church and nation... so let's look to God. As we pray I have faith and confidence that God will lead us in our next steps.

May the Lord reign in our lives, our Parishes, our nation etc... Lord, have your way in us, amongst us and around us: in government, international relationship, scientific research, economic activity, public services, private enterprise, community engagement, voluntary services, in churches, in homes and in me. Pray 'your kingdom come, your will be done.' In so doing we are praying against all that frustrates God's good and loving purposes.
