Good news...



Former Manchester United player and Stoke City manager Lou Macari adapts homeless shelter with

Covid-safe 'pods': Friday 19 February 2021, 7:13am
A homeless shelter opened by former Stoke City
manager and Manchester United and Scotland player
Lou Macari has been adapted with Covid-safe 'pods'.
The Macari Centre, originally opened in 2016 on Regent
Road in Hanley in Stoke-on-Trent. However, in May last
year, the government deemed all dormitory-style
accommodation no longer safe due to coronavirus
guidelines. 40 people had been using the centre, which
was providing them with a hot meal and access to



advice to help them find more sustainable housing, when the pandemic first struck.

Determined to not let the residents end up back on the streets, the former midfielder worked with the city council to move the shelter to a nearby warehouse. Using glamping-style pods, Macari was able to provide a safe space for people from the virus. Each pod is kitted out with new beds, heaters, TVs and there are numbers on each door to give the residents proof of address - to help with employment.



Macari said he had to move quickly to find a new space and then found the warehouse which was the same size as a football pitch to help those who are homeless.

Inside each pod is a person, given a helping hand in the hardest of times - from the man who wants everyone to be at the top of their game.

I don't know what Lou Macari's religious beliefs are, but this is Kingdom stuff and just shows that there are some amazing people out there doing amazing things.

Coronavirus Reopening Roadmap - Comments from the Bishop of London 22 February 2021

The Bishop of London, Sarah Mullally, who chairs the Church of England's Coronavirus Recovery Group, has responded following the Prime Minister's statement to Parliament.

She said: I am grateful to the Prime Minister for sharing these proposals to ease the current restrictions in a way which gives us all some clarity and enables people to begin to plan. We will study the details and, working with Government Departments, refine our own advice for local churches in the weeks ahead. We all look forward to being able to meet in larger groups again later this year and today's announcement will be especially encouraging for couples planning weddings, among others.

When the first lockdown was introduced last year, we were – as we are now – in the midst of Lent, a time of preparation and self-reflection for Christians as we look forward with hope to Easter and its promise of new life in Jesus Christ.

This has been an incredibly testing time for the whole world – most of all the loved ones of those who have died. The financial cost of the pandemic has been enormous, and we will never truly know the cost of separation and loneliness on individuals and society. But we have also seen remarkable signs of hope. The rapid development and distribution of vaccines has been a phenomenal achievement and I want to thank everyone involved in the process.

The way in which people have reached out to others has been inspirational. Our churches have loved and served their neighbours perhaps like never before and found ways to meet and worship God together we would not have imagined just a year ago. As we look ahead to the prospect of easing of restrictions we know it is still a long road. Yet Easter reminds us we always have hope. Church of England advice will be updated in accordance to the guidance at each stage.
