WEEKLY PARISH BRIEFING SUNDAY 3 May 2020

Learning how to be still and relax

Like many other people I have had to battle with anxiety during my life. My parents showered me with love but boy did I learn how to worry well! I am sure I'm not alone in saying "I know I shouldn't worry but I can't help it. How can I relax and allow peace to penetrate my being?" Rather than preach at myself and you about this I thought I would offer some simple practical guidance that may help some of us with anxious feelings and thoughts. Carve out a little space and try.

Relax: Stop and be still. Sink back into a comfortable chair and let it support you. Remember and try to visualise God's promise that "Underneath are (his) everlasting arms." *Deuterononmy 33:27*

Relax your muscles: Have your feet planted flat on the floor. (God is a sure foundation)

Now unclench your hands, deliberately drop your shoulders down, let your jaw and lips open slightly. If your neck feels stiff (<u>DON'T</u> do this if you have a neck problem) then gently stretch your neck. Feel the relief of letting go.

Now slow your breathing down. Allow your breathing to become deeper, so that you're drawing in breath with your tummy as well as your rib cage.

Calming breathing:

Breathing well is a very spiritual thing. God breaths life... Genesis 2:7 & Job 33:4. Jesus breathed on the disciples after his resurrection saying "receive the Holy Spirit" John 20:22.

- Breathe deeply and slowly right down to your tum (feel your chest relax & tummy knots untangle).
- As you breathe in, Breathe in God's life & peace: and out, Breathe out all the anxiety and worry.

When we panic, we over breathe. Anxiety triggers our fight or flight mechanism, which is fine if we're being chased by a wild animal, but not when we're sitting down or trying to get on with daily life!

Invite God's Presence

Ask for the Spirit of God to come. Picture a warm wave of the Spirit rolling down you, calming you and taking your anxiety with it. "Let go: Let God."

- Take time to repeat a prayer or verse e.g. "Come Lord Jesus" or "Be still and know that I am God."
- Perhaps ponder the words of Jesus in Matthew 28:11 "Come to me all who are weary and carrying heavy burdens and I will give you rest"
- Listen to a favourite piece of music, hymn or contemporary worship song that you can focus on.
- Do one enjoyable thing each day e.g. A warm relaxing bath, a favourite book or programme, a thoughtful walk outside **if permitted**.

I am so thankful that the Christian faith doesn't shy away from tackling issues of worry and anxiety. There are many Bible verses that reveal and address this human struggle. The Christian tradition of meditation and contemplation provides rich material and experience for us all to draw on. In this season of Eastertide we frequently recall how the risen Jesus stood amongst his disciples and said "peace be with you." Jesus imparts peace, calms our fears and can deliver us from the bondage to worry and give us life.

May Christ the Good Shepherd call you and lead you into peace God bless
