#### Who is my neighbour ...?

Thank the Lord for the wonders of the Internet and the abilities it gives for us to be able to connect to each other. There are tremendous opportunities for mission and ministry online and the Team here are looking to use them where we can. Thank the Lord also for those amongst us who have a real gifting in this area! I have to say I feel quite inadequate in this area and have felt significant pressure to suddenly become a web guru using all the latest tech to live stream life transforming material from my office! However, it's not my forte, but that's okay! I was reminded this last week by the Archdeacon that in the months and years to come I/we will not be remembered so much for our online services in and of themselves (unless we set ourselves on fire like that poor Vicar in Cornwall). Rather, we will be remembered for our pastoral care and our love one for another.

On that theme, a question we all need to be asking in the light of self-isolation and the cessation of church and community activity is, 'who is my neighbour?' It was a question posed to Jesus (Luke 10:29) which led him to tell the story of the Good Samaritan. Ask yourself who you could be looking out for during this time who may be isolated, lonely or struggling in some way? Instead of waiting for the phone to ring or the email to arrive perhaps why not reach out. Who is there in your usual network that God has put on your mind and heart? Why not get in touch with them if you can and see if they're okay? This is a chance for us to 'do relationship really well.'

At the end of all this there is a lot of hope and prayer that we will learn some important things in this time and not return to some of the old ways that are not so good. Not least that we will continue to have a heightened awareness of our connectedness to one another and our interdependence as communities and as the Body of Christ.

#### **Holy Week**

Over these coming days Christians here in our parishes and across the world will be remembering the life changing and history changing story of Jesus Christ and the promise of new life and hope he brings to our lives and our world through His passion, death and resurrection. The message speaks very much to our world at this time. As I wrote last week, and as Tom reiterated in his Passion Sunday sermon, the God we have come to know in the person of Jesus Christ is 'the crucified God,' (Maltman) who knows the depths of suffering intimately. BUT... He is also the one who brings life and hope and resurrection. May we share in Christ's sufferings but also know the power and wonder of new life and resurrection in the days ahead (Philippians 3:10, 1 Peter 1:3, 1 Peter 4:13, Romans 8:18).

Tom will be streaming a live Eucharist Monday-Thursday and these will be on the Parish Facebook and YouTube pages.

**Tidenham PCC** - In a Parish first, the PCC met virtually, on Monday 30 March. We were able to discuss the Coronavirus situation, its impact upon the Parish and our response, the required necessary works on Tidenham Tower and a new Foundation Governor for our Church School in Tutshill. **Funerals** - Funerals can only happen at the Crematorium or at the graveside involving immediate family members (if permitted), a very distressing situation. The Parish is able to offer a Memorial Service or Service of Thanksgiving at a later date with family and friends gathered together.

**Baptisms** - Emergency baptisms can take place in hospital or at home, though subject to strict hygienic precautions and physical distancing as far as possible.

This has gone some way to helping alleviate the potential deficit of approx £1,000 per month without weekly services and offerings.
