Our New Parish Office

The Friends of Tidenham Church purchased the building outside the Lych Gate at Tidenham on the 13th of July this year. It is being converting it into a new Parish Office, and the building will comprise an office/meeting room, a kitchen (we were not able to put one in the church) and a disabled lavatory.

Once we owned the building it was discovered that the state of the roof timbers was poor, riddled with woodworm, so the project has increased in cost and scope and we have had to completely replace all the roof timbers. The building is now re-roofed and watertight and the structure is being created inside.

We have decided that we want the running cost of the building to be as low as possible and so to help that:

- We are insulating the building to be as close to an A rating as possible. This reduced the internal volume but we are inserting significant insulation.
- We have 7 solar panels on the building which will generate 3.5kw of power.
- We will put in a battery bank to store the electricity.
- We are putting in an air to water heat source pump.
- We have zoned the building and put in underfloor heating.

To give a feel for the measures we are taking to reduce running costs here are some facts on the floor: 34 tonnes of hardcore, 5 tonnes of sand, damp proof membrane and radon barrier, 100mm of concrete, another membrane, 90mm of insulation, underfloor heating, another membrane, 65mm screed.

Outside the building we will put in paving so there is a seating area at the side of the building, a disabled ramp to the churchyard and behind the building there is a new wall and another seating area.

We could only achieve all of this with the generous support of the Tony James legacy which is funding the project. The building, now registered on the Post Office data base, is called **The Tony James Memorial Building**.

Post Communion




