After about 15 years fate was to intervene as Sue was diagnosed with ovarian cancer and around the same time I was diagnosed with Non – Hodgkin's Lymphoma so we were both receiving chemotherapy. After a brave fight Sue's cancer got the better of her but we had the last two years together. Sue was adamant that I was to have a life after she had gone and believe me, the wrath of Sue would have descended upon me if I had not fulfilled her wish for me.
