# <u>Christian News</u> Our Faith in Today's World



- † Head of Nigerian Christian village among three killed by Islamist gunmen in Plateau State Islamist gunmen attacked a Christian-majority community in Plateau State, Nigeria on 17 October, killing three people including the head of the village, Salisu Idris.
- **Two more former Chibok schoolgirls found in Borno, Nigeria:** Two young Nigerian women kidnapped as teenagers by Boko Haram Islamist terrorists from a school in eight years ago have been found
- † Naser Navard Goltapeh released from Evin Prison: An Iranian Christian convert from Islam has been released mid-way through his ten-year prison sentence





† Extremists block bus carrying Christian children to event in Madhya Pradesh, India: Extremists intercepted a bus carrying tribal children, claiming that the event was being organised to convert attendees by force.



† Hunger is increasing, our Christian family remains in need: The 2022 Global Hunger Index, published on 13 October by humanitarian groups Concern Worldwide and Welthungerhilfe, outlined once again the scale of the global food crisis.

WARM SPACES, ENERGY SUPPORT, CHRISTMAS §
SUNDAY MEALS: This Winter threatens to be one of the toughest for some people in living memory. Various initiatives are in place to try and take the sting out of some of this.

Libraries, Village Halls and many other community places are being designated as 'WARM PLACES', lists are being compiled, and local contacts will know what is available in each locality. My colleague Frances Palmer is co-ordinating FOD Council's response.

Various energy support measures are in place. Broadly speaking money has been provided for energy companies to refund part of the current very high bills. Pensioners will receive an additional winter fuel payment this year. People on certain benefits are also getting additional monies. People in furnished rented accommodation are intended to benefit from a parallel scheme.

RISING SUN, WOODCROFT: After being closed for 12 years The Rising Sun has finally reopened as a local community pub, completely owned by people in the local community. As I write it's only been open for 2 ½ weeks but has already had a very busy 'soft opening', official opening and Open Mic/Acoustic Club. I hope all our local pubs and cafes manage to keep open and flourish through the times ahead.

MEMORY CAFES: Woolaston Memory Café has started up again after Covid and Lockdown, and is gradually picking up, it really has had to start from scratch. It meets every Thursday afternoon, 2 to 4 at Woolaston Village hall.

Sedbury Memory Café meets the  $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$  week of the month, on Wednesday afternoons 2-3.30 in the Sedbury & Beachley Village Hall.

# The Legend of St. Nicholas: The Real Santa Claus www.history.com

The legend of Santa Claus can be traced back hundreds of years to a monk named St. Nicholas. It is believed that Nicholas was born sometime around 280 A.D. in Patara, near Myra in modern-day Turkey. Much admired for his piety and kindness, St. Nicholas became the subject of many legends. It is said that he gave away all of his inherited wealth and travelled the countryside helping the poor and sick. One of the best-known St. Nicholas stories is the time he saved three poor sisters from being sold into slavery or prostitution by their father by providing them with a dowry so that they could be married.

Over the course of many years, Nicholas's popularity spread and he became known as the protector of children and sailors. His feast day is celebrated on the anniversary of his death, December 6. This was traditionally considered a lucky day to make large purchases or to get married. By the Renaissance, St. Nicholas was the most popular saint in Europe. Even after the Protestant Reformation, when the veneration of saints began to be discouraged, St. Nicholas maintained a positive reputation, especially in Holland.

Several stories tell of Nicholas and the sea. When he was young, Nicholas sought to be holy by making a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. There as he walked where Jesus walked, he sought to more deeply experience Jesus' life, passion, and resurrection. Returning by sea, a mighty storm threatened to wreck the ship. Nicholas calmly prayed. The terrified sailors were amazed when the wind and waves suddenly calmed, sparing them all. So St. Nicholas is the patron of sailors and voyagers.

Other stories tell of Nicholas saving his people from famine, sparing the lives of those innocently accused, and much more. He did many kind and generous deeds in secret, expecting nothing in return. Within a century of his death he was celebrated as a saint. Today he is venerated in the East as a wonder, or miracle worker and in the West as patron of a great variety of persons: children, mariners, bankers, pawn-brokers, scholars, orphans, labourers, travellers, merchants, judges, paupers, marriageable maidens, students, sailors, victims of judicial mistakes, captives, perfumers, even thieves and murderers! He is known as the friend and protector of all in trouble or need.

Ann who organises our trips has a varied Programme planned for 2023 and we are so pleased to welcome new and old members to join us on these outings.



#### PCC Members: -

- Thanked our new Treasurer Paul Coombs and Secretary Iain Gardiner for creating the annual accounts for 2021, which our independent examiner Andy Royle checked
- ➤ Prepared for the special church meeting on Sunday 25 September authorised by Bishop Rachel at which the approved accounts were presented to church members.
- Agreed to open Tutshill church every Monday throughout winter to provide a warm space location for the whole community
- ➤ Heard presentations from Peter Gilchrist Chair of the friends of Tidenham Church, on their proposal to purchase and refurbish Church cottage garage.
- Agreed to raise our three staff salaries to reflect the rising cost of living
- > Agreed to extend the Wellbeing Chaplain role for a further 2 years from 01 October
- Renewed our church insurance with Ecclesiastical for 3 years and our annual CCLI licence.
- Approved £4k spend on the inspection and significant necessary repairs to Tidenham church electrical systems including replacing the floodlights
- Welcomed the availability of broadband at Tutshill church from July
- Agreed to a revised policy for distributing money to local and national and international charities
- Agreed to change the start time of Tidenham Sunday services to 09:00 followed by coffee and tea
- Organised the first drone inspection of our three churches as part of the 5 -year inspection of our three church buildings

# Confirmation Joy



# Bishop Rachel's Christmas Message

As Christmas comes into focus, so does the issue of choice – whether it is about choosing presents or food, or who to be with, or those hard choices about what can and cannot be afforded financially.

We live in a consumerist society which constantly places choice on a pedestal, not least through advertising and endless slogans provoking us to choose that thing or experience which will bring happiness and satisfaction. Whilst our desire to choose can be about love and care, it can also spring from unhealthy places within us – places of selfishness, fear, or a desire to be special. of our God to be merciful and to love with a love stronger than even death itself.

'Those events of the first Christmas are full of choice: Mary who said yes to God's call; Joseph who chose to trust; everyday shepherds on a hillside choosing to be curious; and strangers from a foreign land choosing to take a risk and follow a star. All of them were participating in the kingdom story of God who in Jesus Christ chooses to call us friends:

'... I have called you friends... You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another'.

(John 15:15–17)

This Christmas is about choice, but not merely regarding gifts, food and activity, but about how we choose to respond to God's invitation of love revealed in the gift of Jesus Christ.
